
This charmingly funny board book celebrates a family's unconditional love for their slurpy, burpy, boisterous new baby.

"Mercy?" she said.





"Let me ponder it."


Buddy Lamp pondered.



Amazingly, the embryos of many animals look almost identical at this early stage of their development, so it's not easy to tell which animal they're going to grow into. A tiny embryo might one day grow into a frog or a fruit bat. It could turn into a crocodile or a chicken, a haddock or a human!

Wait a minute, though... embryos need somewhere safe to grow, so most animals lay eggs. An egg is a protective casing packed with food and water that the embryo inside uses to grow into a baby.




We all move around

Animals move in so many different ways! There are animals that walk, run, crawl, swim, dive, slide, glide, climb, hop, jump and fly. Parasites may even burrow inside the bodies of other animals to feed on them. Moving is one of those things that ALL animals do.


Muscles pull on an animal's body, allowing it to move. If the animal has bones, like we do, the muscles pull on joints, which are where two or more bones meet. In some ways we animals work like glant puppets, with muscles as strings pulling on our bones. But if the animal doesn't have bones, the joints are hinged body parts made from connecting parts of a stiff outer shell. If you look at a lobster or prawn, you'll see the joints in its shell and legs.

Almost every animal on this planet moves using muscles. (Well, apart from some simple creatures that can get by without them.) But why do animals like us move? It's because we all have to go and find our food and stay safe from danger.


We all communicate

Do you love catching up with friends? If so, that's no surprise, because humans can be very chatty! But we don't just communicate by talking. We also use visual signals, touch and smell. Other animals get their message across in a variety of ways, too.

Many animals communicate with sound, especially when they can't see each other. They may sing to attract partners, give alarm calls that warn of danger and make noises to stay in touch with the rest of their family or group.

Animals also move their body or change their appearance to communicate. They might wiggle a wing, wag a tail, flap a fin or even completely change colour. These displays are like talking in secret code. When animals meet, they communicate with touch, too. A stroke or a poke, or a lick or a kick, reveals if they want to be friends or not!

Most amazingly of all, some animals have a kind of invisible message system. They produce chemical signals called pheromones. These scents linger a long time and spread through the air, water and earth to communicate with other members of the same species.

INTRODUCTION

Born on 15 February 1874, Shackleton was the second of ten children. From a young age, Shackleton complained about teachers, but he had a keen interest in books, especially poetry – years later, on expeditions, he would read to his crew to lift their spirits. Always restless, the young Ernest left school at 16 to go to sea. After working his way up the ranks, he told his friends, "I think I can do something better, I want to make a name for myself."




Shackleton was a member of Captain Scott's famous Discovery Expedition (1901–1904), and told reporters that he had always been "strangely drawn to the mysterious south," and that unexplored parts of the world "held a strong fascination for me from my earliest memories."

Once Amundsen reached the **South Pole** ahead of Scott, Shackleton realised that there was only one great challenge left. He wrote: "The first crossing of the Antarctic continent, from sea to sea, via the Pole, apart from its historic value, will be a journey of great scientific importance."

On 8 August 1914, Ernest Shackleton and his brave crew set out to cross the vast south polar continent, **Antarctica**. Shackleton's epic journey would be the last expedition of the Heroic Age of Antarctic Exploration (1888–1914). His story is one fraught with unimaginable peril, adventure and, above all, endurance.

ENDURANCE

Originally intended for tourist cruises and polar hunting, the *Endurance* (or *Polaris* as she was initially named) was perhaps the strongest wooden vessel in the world, with the exception of the *Fram*. She was named after Shackleton's family motto: *By Endurance, We Conquer*.







Endurance was designed by Ole Aanderud Larsen, and constructed under the watch of master shipbuilder Christian Jacobsen, at Framnaes shipyard in Sandefjord, Norway.

Jacobsen, being a meticulous craftsman, made sure that all the men who worked on the ship's construction were experienced seafarers as well as skilled shipwrights.






One of the main differences between the *Endurance* and the *Fram* was that the *Fram* was bowl-bottomed, allowing her to rise out of the ice if she became stuck.





Luckily for Shackleton, the original owners Adrien de Gerlache and Lars Chistensen were in financial straits and desperate to sell the ship. Being supportive of Shackleton's intentions, they were happy to sell *Endurance* for £11,600 (approx £45,000 in today's currency), a fraction of the original cost.





Being such a unique ship, *Endurance* had to be worked on with a whole host of conventional and unconventional carpentry tools.




Endurance was built from Norwegian fir, oak and greenheart.




Her keel was made up of four sandwiched pieces of solid oak, totalling to a thickness of nearly 2.2 metres, while both her sides were 0.7 metres thick.

A very robust and sturdy little ship, *Endurance* was designed specifically to withstand harsh polar conditions. This meant that wherever possible joints and fittings were **cross-braced** and strengthened, making her extremely strong.



Later on, a platform was rigged under the **jib boom** so that Hurley was able to film the ship breaking through **pack ice**.



The bow (the front) would be used like a battering ram to break up thick ice, so it had to be especially strong. In total, it was 1.3 metres thick!



Each piece of timber had been selected carefully from a single oak tree, so that it would fit the design and curvature of the ship.








EXTREME WEATHER




SAHARAN AIR LAYER

The Saharan Air Layer is a dense mass of hot air and dust particles up to 3 km thick that covers the desert. It whirls west over the Atlantic Ocean to the Americas every summer.

STORMY WEATHER

Dust and sandstorms occur when wind picks up dust from the ground and carries it in the air for miles. The Sahara Desert is the world's largest source of dust, and its dust storms can travel as far as South America. Sandstorms have larger particles that can cause more damage.

OASIS

An oasis is an area of land in a desert where water pools at the surface, whether natural or human-made. For desert dwellers and weary travellers, an oasis is a sanctuary. A place to drink water, rest and recuperate in shade away from the blistering sun. Without oases, life in the desert would not be possible.

This is how an oasis forms...

Step 1.

Showers tumble down the ridges of far-away mountains, and rushing torrents of flash floods cause rivers to spill over.

Oasis water can travel long distances from its original source.

Because of the life-giving forces of desert oases, settlements have

sprung up alongside them. Ouarzazate is the biggest oasis town in the

OASIS TOWNS

Step 2.

This water then seeps into the ground and flows along underground passageways, before being absorbed by rocks near the surface.

Some oasis water is referred to as 'fossil water'. It is non-renewable (it can't be replaced) and has been held in underground rocks for millions of years.

Step 3.

Finally, water oozes out of these rocks into an overground pool. Erosion or faults in the ground can also cause water to spill out at the surface.
